DIVING FOR OLYMPIC GLORY AFTER CAREER-THREATENING INJURY

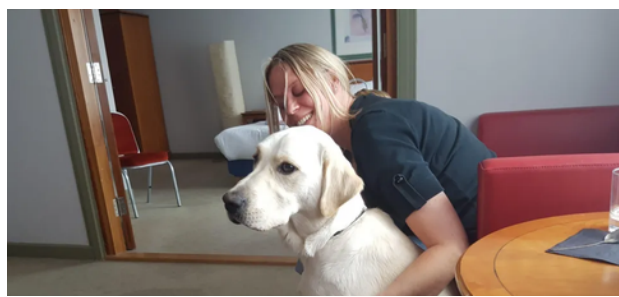


When Team GB's Kyle Kothari reflects back on the journey to his first ever Olympic Games, he feels proud. The 26-year-old is preparing to go for glory in the men's 10m platform dive, the same event in which Tom Daley won bronze in Tokyo. After medals in lower-profile events, Kyle faced the possibility of career-ending operations, first in 2019 for a ruptured left Achilles, and then the same injury on the other foot in 2021 - six months before the last Games in Tokyo. "At that point, I wasn't sure I'd be able to come back," he tells BBC Asian Network. Kyle says he started exploring life outside of sport, even working at JP Morgan as an analyst for seven months. But receiving an offer to work full-time made him realise he couldn't leave the sport just yet." Especially when I knew if I could stay injury-free, I knew how good I could be. "If I didn't give it a go, I'd be cheating myself later down the line." Now, he says he is grateful for National Lottery funding, and hopes that sports in general can become better-paying, so it becomes a realistic career path for people from diverse backgrounds.



BLIND WOMAN 'NERVOUS BUT EXCITED' ABOUT SKYDIVE

A blind woman doing a skydive to raise money for charity says she is "nervous but excited" - and expects her guide dog to be excited too. Louann Kent is doing the tandem skydive to raise money for [Guide Dogs, external](#), which partnered her with Ugo the golden retriever back in 2017. Mrs Kent, who is from Derby, said Ugo had transformed her life and enabled her to do things independently. She is one of more than 100 people across the UK who are taking part in 12 different skydive events for Guide Dogs, which they have nicknamed Blind Panic. Collectively they are hoping to raise £100,000. Claire Robotham, a fundraising manager for Guide Dogs, said: "We'd like to say a big thank you to Louann and all the volunteers taking part in the Blind Panic challenge, helping to raise vital funds for our organisation."



Rioting and violence amplifies the UK's employee personal safety crisis

As the rioting and violence over the past weeks continues to send shockwaves through our workplaces and communities, market-leading personal safety technology provider, Peoplesafe, has seen a 10% upsurge in demand for personal safety alarms in the past two weeks alone.

As is evident from this upsurge, press coverage and news reports, many workers across all sectors are gravely concerned for their personal safety. Lone working staff, particularly those employed in retail, hospitality and healthcare are feeling vulnerable.

“Terrible events like this bring to the fore concerns for personal safety. We have seen in research that this is not just down to isolated events – it is always there,” says Peoplesafe CEO, Naz Dossa, also BSIA Chair of the Lone Working Group.

We know from our research that seven million workers in the UK already worry about their safety each week. Pre-riots, 57% were already concerned about facing aggression from the public, and one in four were already saying they would prefer not to take a role that involved face-to-face contact with the public. 62% cited personal safety concerns among the reasons for this.

This is not acceptable.

Chartwell Trust Care takes any of these behaviours seriously. As a care provider and an employer, Chartwell Trust Care has a legal and moral responsibility to protect their employees and service users from the humiliation and indignity of harassment. For all our employees who are feeling unsafe, you can raise your concern with your line manager or the manager.






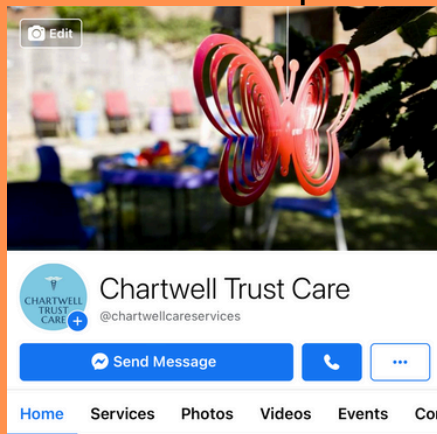

REFER A FRIEND CHANGES

We have reviewed and made changes to the refer a friend scheme. In order for Chartwell employees to qualify for referral payments, the candidate must work a set amount of hours for, which applies to both full time and bank employees. The candidate must have worked 1000 hours to qualify for payment.

The refer a friend form must be signed by the referrer and referral. The home manager must sign the form once the candidate is assigned to their place of work. Once completed, the form must be sent to HR and Payroll to approve the payment.

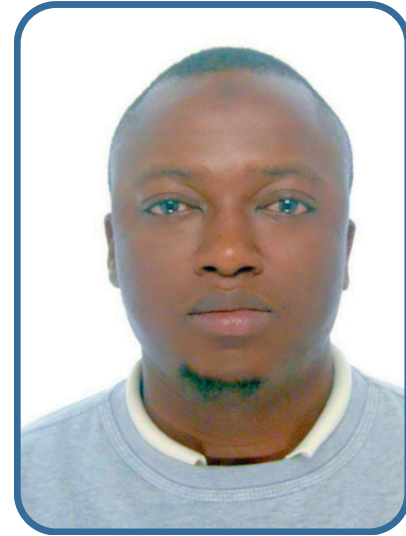
Congratulations to
